

RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Amherst pursuant to Section 169 of Chapter 309 of the Revised Statutes of Nova Scotia, 1967 the Towns Act that the following bylaw be and the same is hereby enacted and that the Clerk be and is hereby instructed to forward same to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and the Minister of Highways with a request for their approvals hereof.

BYLAW RE CLOSING OF PORTION OF SENATOR AVENUE

1. THAT the Council do close to public use a street or portion of the said street known as Senator Avenue:
2. THAT the street or portion thereof hereby closed to public use pursuant to Section 1 of this by-law is as follows:

ALL that certain lot, piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being in the town of Amherst, in the county of Cumberland in the Province of Nova Scotia and being more particularly bounded and described as follows:

BEGINNING on the south east margin of Academy Street at an iron pipe being two hundred and seventy-eight feet (278'0) from the eastern boundary of Church Street, measured northeasterly along the south boundary of Senator Avenue:

THENCE running northeasterly along aforementioned line two hundred and eighty-four feet (284') more or less to an iron pipe at the west margin of Charles Street:

THENCE along said margin of Charles Street to the north margin of Senator Avenue which margin is parallel and fifty feet (50') northerly from the south margin of said street:

THENCE southwesterly along said parallel line until the east margin of Academy Street is reached:

THENCE southwesterly along the east margin of Academy Street to the place of beginning.

3. THAT the portion of Senator Avenue as described in Section 2 of this bylaw be closed and that all rights of public user heretofore as a street in the lands hereinbefore more particularly-described are forever extinguished and the said town may sell and convey the street or any portion thereof.
