- ↶ 3. Turn left onto Church St/Glooscap Trl/NS-2 S (signs for Nova Scotia Trunk 2)
i Continue to follow Church St/Glooscap Trl
- ↷ 4. Turn right onto Albion St/Glooscap Trl/NS-2 S
i Continue to follow Glooscap Trl/NS-2 S
- ↑ 5. Turn left onto the TC/NS-104 E ramp to Springhill/Truro/Halifax
